From Burdens to Blessings

There is not an overwhelming amount of information given about Naphtali in the Bible. His name is recorded 50 times in Scripture. Many of these uses concern land, borders, or his descendants. However, we do know that he was the son of Bilhah, Rachel's handmaid. When the law was given during the possession of the land, his people were one of the Lupton Drive Baptist Church groups chosen to pronounce the cursing of the law, and

not the blessings. However, as is often the case from our Lord, from this humble beginning and unenviable task, God delivers a great blessing.

These blessings are outlined in Genesis 49:21, which are the words given from Jacob to his son Naphtali: "Naphtali is a hind let loose: he giveth goodly words." This simple verse has proven to be an amazing prophecy concerning someone from a most humble beginning:

"A hind let loose." His land was good and fruitful. His people have been blessed for generations with gardens, palm trees, fig trees and olive trees. His people are lovers of liberty, well spoken, courteous.

"He giveth goodly words." It was from his land that Christ and His disciples did many great works. The light of the glorious Gospel of Christ shined brightly here. Christ's chief residence was in Capernaum, which is from Naphtali. He wrought great miracles there, and it is commonly agreed that the apostles were principally of the tribe of Naphtali. The land they possessed (the west and the south) brought forth the best of the "goodly words" ever given.

In Deut. 33:23, Naphtali's descendants are described as "satisfied with favour, and full with the blessing of the LORD: [and told to] possess thou the west and the south." Here, God takes this "burden" (son of a handmaid) and "blesses" him abundantly, leaving him satisfied with favor. It is clear that they could be content, complete, and compassed with the blessings of God.

Have you ever thought that your life has many more burdens than blessings? Perhaps we all have. There are three areas of the Christian life that can truly turn our burdens to blessings:

Our Worship - If we keep our heart focused on the Lord, our problems will seem small. We should dwell upon the goodness of God, and being content with who God is! Always remember that God is greater than our problems.

Our Work - Stay busy serving the Lord, and keep your mind set upon the Great Commission. When we are satisfied in serving the Lord Jesus, our mind does not have time to dwell upon the "things" that mean so little. My friend, there is so much work to do!

Our Will - being surrendered to His will. Remember that God will do a better job with your life than you will! Simply allow Him full control.

Praise God for His guidance and to advance his kingdom. We finished out 2021 with several blessings. In November, we paid off the church building and parking lot. The same day I was contacted by an architect about coming to look at our situation. Estelle GARCIA, an architecte

> from Charleville-Mézières, came and said she would check with our town authorities and let us know if we are allowed to build. This was a big plus because most architects that we have encountered refuse to work for religious outfits.

> December 29, 2021, the architect informed us that we are allowed to build on our parking lot if we respect the various construction codes. This is great news. Her services are quite steep (\$55,000)! Please pray that she will be willing to draw up the plans for

our church building project. Usually the architect wants to coordinate the work and file all the necessary work permits, but this adds too much to the bill; we just want

the blueprints so we can hire out the work ourselves. God is at work in France!
